School Council Minutes 13 March 2017

The School Council members talked about what parliament is, how it makes important decisions for the country.

Mr Bourton explained that when we go to the School Parliament, we will be debating behaviours in school. We will talk about playtimes, lunchtimes, discussing if homework is a good idea or not, behaviour in class as well as other things. We will look at the good behaviours and poor behaviours. Mr Bourton explained that the councillors will have a chance to voice their opinion and also share with the other schools all our good ideas from our school. Mrs Lax mentioned how our council suggested that we have music in the playground and this is a good idea which can be shared.

Mr Bourton explained that there will be videos to watch, we have made a video in the dining hall to show good and poor behaviour.

Mr Bourton mentioned that there will be older children as well, but everyone will have a chance to speak.

Doug (Zebra Class) mentioned that not all School Council were in the video.

Mrs Lax explained that there will be photographs taken on the day so everyone will have a chance to be a star, even if they were not in our video.

Mrs Lax said that everyone needs to do good listening, just as they are today.

Mr Bourton will send a letter home so you can think about the parliament and what will be discussed on the day.

Mrs Lax introduced Rebecca, Sarah, Ian and Hannah from the Canterbury City Council, who look after Canterbury, Herne Bay and Whitstable play parks. They want to make Burton Fields even better and Mrs Lax asked the children for some fun ideas for a new playground.

Rebecca asked the councillors to look at two suggested play designs and discuss what they liked about them as well as what else might be good.

Rebecca said that the new playground will be open in the summer just before the school holidays, and invited the councillors to go along with the Junior School councillors to test out the new playground before it was officially opened.

The children viewed the plans and gave fabulous feedback. They each filled out an evaluation form.
